



definition of the ton group as joint controllers

With regard to Article 26 of the European Parliament and European Council General Data Protection Regulation (EU Regulation 2016/679), this document defines the TON Group as joint controllers. Article 26 explains how joint controllers are to determine their respective responsibilities in order to ensure that data subjects are able to exercise their rights under the regulation.

The TON Group jointly determines the purposes and means of processing personal information and ensures the fulfilment of the rights of data subjects whose information is processed by the following companies:

What are the responsibilities of the individual companies within the TON Group?

TON a.s. provides the TON Group with a complete information management system for the implementation of all business and manufacturing processes within the group.

The other companies within the group are responsible for the business agenda within their respective country and for meeting national-level legal obligations in relation to accounting and payroll record keeping.

As joint controllers, members of the TON Group have the right to share information within the group for administration purposes, including for the processing of customer and employee personal data.

Responsibility for fulfilling the rights of data subjects and for providing the information outlined in Articles 13 and 14 of EU Regulation 2016/679 falls to the specific group members who are processing the relevant subject's data. Data subjects can exercise their rights by contacting any of the members of the group through the point of contact identified above.

All group members are required to cooperate with the competent authorities overseeing the correct implementation of this regulation.
